Round 3 : The Final Treasure	Teams race against time to complete a series of mini-challenges, unlocking each new task through speed, teamwork, and problem-solving. The first to solve it and find the treasure wins.

Rules & Regulations:

- Each team must nominate one representative during registration.
- Tampering with or destroying clues/materials is strictly prohibited.
- Taking multiple clues meant for other teams will result in disqualification.
- Misbehaviour with coordinators or other participants will not be tolerated.

Mid-Event Twist – Adapt & Elevate	An unexpected constraint will be introduced. Teams must incorporate it into their campaign, demonstrating creativity, adaptability, and execution under pressure.

Deliverables:

- 60–90 Second Campaign Video
- 1 Promotional Poster
- 1 Brand Snapshot (Name, USP, Target Audience, Tagline)

Rules and Regulations:

- Any use of unfair means will result in disqualification
- All submissions must be completed within 3 hours
- Internet and editing tools are permitted
- All content must be original

Team Format: A team must consist of 2–3 members.

Event structure:

Round 1: The Rapid Pitch	Teams receive a domain through a randomized selection system and have 15 minutes to brainstorm. Teams must deliver a maximum 3-minute pitch to convey their idea convincingly.
Round 2: The Board Room Showdown	Top teams proceed to the next stage, where the CEOs from each team are given real-world market scenarios and must protect the value of their product.

Rules & Regulations

- Carry your own stationery such as pens.
- Teams should maintain a respectful and professional attitude throughout the event.
- Using electronic devices during Round 1 is strictly prohibited
- The judges scores are final and binding.
- Time Management
 - Round 1: 3 minutes pitch
 - Round 2: 5 minutes cross questioning from the judges panel

Event Structure:

Round 1 : Contemporary Trends	Tests awareness of current pop culture through a live-response quiz. Top-scoring teams qualify for the next round.
Round 2 : Title the Picture	Teams identify a movie or song based on visual clues such as symbols, characters, or objects. Correct answers earn points.
Round 3 : The Final Reveal	Questions are presented through three progressive clues – broad, specific, and direct – related to major entertainment and cultural moments.

Round 2 : Trivia	Fun quiz questions with specific rules (reference: the Waveform podcast) 30 second timer for each. Materials: PPT and buzzer app for phones Duration: 15-20 min
Round 3 : Design Glitch	Objective: Test creativity, UI/design thinking, and problem-solving under limits Participants: Qualified teams (2-3 members each) Duration: 1 hour

Round 1 : (Crack the Code)	Teams solve riddles, puzzles, and hidden clues to unlock key information. Speed and accuracy earn points and advance them forward.
Round 2 : (The Case File Investigation)	Teams analyse a murder mystery file with evidence, suspects, and statements to identify the culprit and motive.
Round 3 : (The Ultimate Twist Case)	A challenging final case with unexpected twists. Teams must analyse clues and present a clear crime theory.

Rules & Regulations

- Each team must have 1–2 members only
- Official investigation materials and answer sheets will be provided
- Use of internet or external assistance is strictly prohibited
- Any use of unfair practices will result in disqualification

A fast and fun debate competition that tests how quickly you can think on your feet. You will need to come up with strong arguments for both sides of a single topic. This event challenges you to put your personal opinions aside, control the flow of your words, and build great arguments on the spot.

Team Format: A team must consist of 2–3 members.

Event structure:

Round 1 : The Creative Qualifier	A pen-and-paper screening round where teams answer a set of unique questions. There are no "correct" answers, teams are shortlisted based on who can provide the wittiest, most creative, and out of the box responses.
Round 2 : The Switch-Up Showdown	The finalist teams receive a topic and have 10 minutes to prep. Speakers give a 5-minute speech, switching sides instantly whenever the bell rings.

Rules & Regulations

- Each participating group must consist of 2 to 3 members
- Teams should be respectful and professional throughout the event
- No phones, laptops, or smart devices are allowed during the 10-minute prep or the speech
- The judges' scores are final
- Speakers will lose points if they freeze or pause for too long after the bell rings before changing their stance

Participants will use advanced prompt engineering techniques to uncover restricted or hidden information embedded within the AI model. The goal is to break logical boundaries, bypass safeguards, and extract valid flags - all within the given time limit.

Team Format: 1-2 members per team

Rules and Regulations

- No DDoS attempts or intentional server abuse.
- No exploitation of platform vulnerabilities outside the AI prompt interface.
- No sharing of flags across teams (that ain't working anyways).

Judging Criteria

- Number of valid flags captured
 - Time of submission
- Disqualification Clause** Any attempt to disrupt the infrastructure, bypass event controls, or violate academic integrity may result in immediate disqualification.
